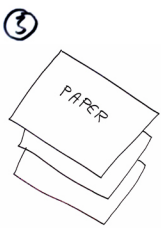
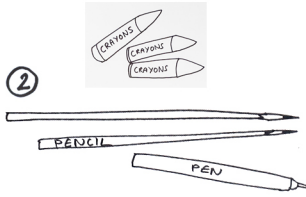
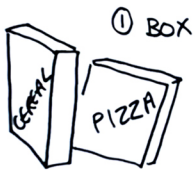


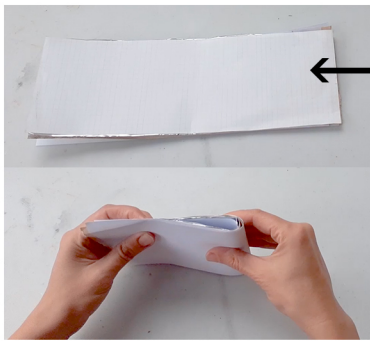
# SKETCHBOOKS

You will need:



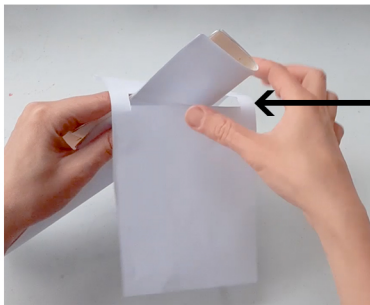
Follow these steps to make your own sketchbook using card, paper and an elastic band!



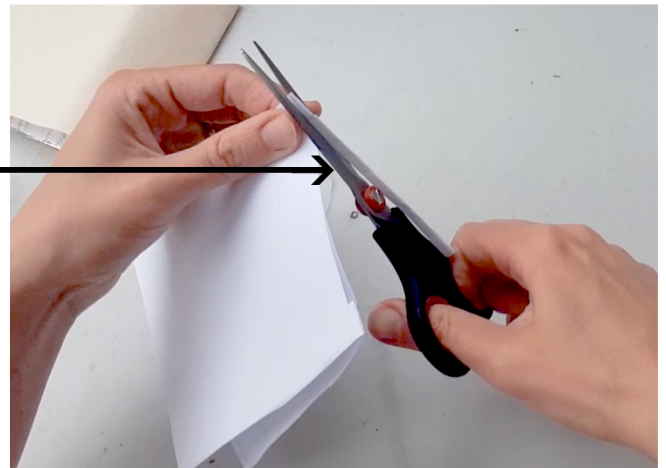
1. Cut 4 pieces of A4 paper in half lengthways you will have 8 pieces now, fold them in half.



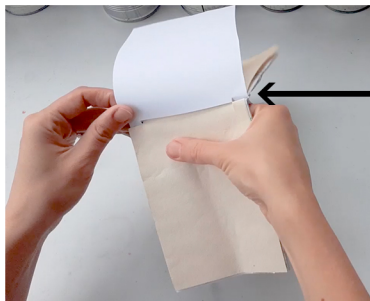
2. Make a snip at each end of the crease, About 5mm long, at least 1cm away from the edge of the paper.



3. Cut between the 'snips' on one of the sheets of paper so that a thin rectangle piece of paper falls away.



4. Roll the 3 other sheets of paper and slip them through the hole you have just cut, like posting a newspaper through a letterbox.



5. Let the snip marks fold over each other so that all the pages are held together.



6. Use some card to cut out a cover, The rectangle should be slightly larger than your opened out sketchbook pages. Put it on the outside and pop an elastic band around the centre -

Your sketchbook is ready! Go outside or stay in and find interesting things to draw.

**Extension Activity:** Look up David Hockney & John Constable's Sketchbooks for inspiration. Draw with pencil, pen, crayon and ink to fill your book.
