




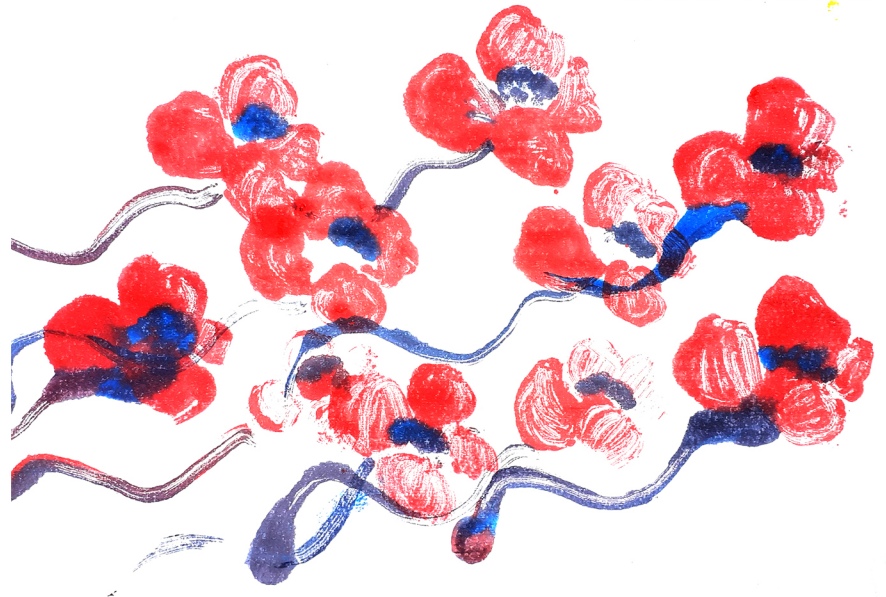


MONOPRINTS

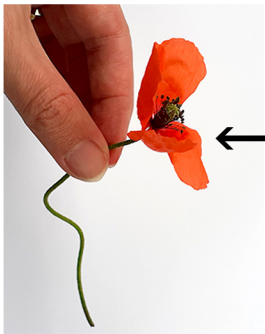

You will need :

- ① BOX

- ② PAINT (not watercolour)

- ③ SMALL BRUSH (or you can use your finger!)

- ④ PAPER

- ⑤ SCISSORS




Follow these steps to make your own monoprint!



1. Find something interesting either outside or inside that you want to draw

2. Use a cardboard box which has a shiny surface (pizza boxes or food packaging usually works well). Use a brush (or your finger) to paint onto the shiny side of the box. You have to be quick so that the paint doesn't dry! It needs to still be wet for the monoprint to work.

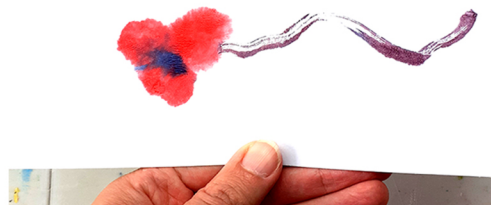
3. Lay a piece of paper over your wet painting and press and rub down so that the paint leaves an impression on the paper.



You have made a monoprint!



Why not try to create a pattern, or try writing words (you must paint the words on backwards!)



Extension Activity: Look up Karl-Otto Götz's artwork for inspiration. Paint abstract patterns with your fingers or use a brush.
